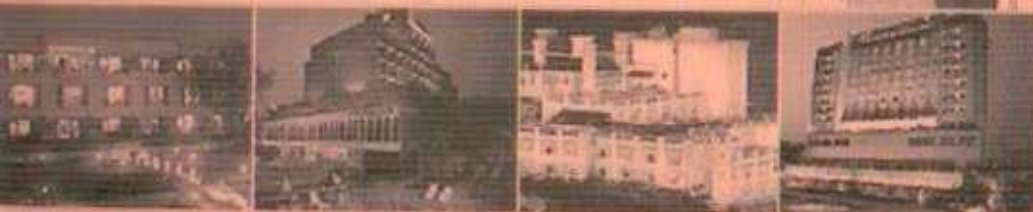

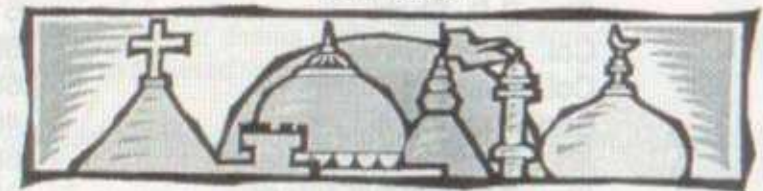

When God created mankind and mankind created music, the Divine, (as descended upon the earth, Divinity manifested itself in the lives of men and through the medium of melodious sound. This was the reason why our evolved the concept of "Nadabrahma" (Infinity itself), singing in our lives.

The origin of music

Of course, all of this did not happen in a moment. Nature supplied the inspiration. The sweet tone of the cuckoo, the melodious cry of the peacock, the cooing of the swans – all these must have suggested, to our early ancestors, that sweetness resides in natural beings. Man's contribution lies, not in recognizing sweetness – that was but natural. It lies in the classification of the notes as "high" and "medium", and in the brilliant concept, that the very ascent and descent gives a pleasure to the mind.

Degrees of ascent

The next step was the evolution of the concept, that the ascent of note itself could be measured and the "degrees" of ascent could be differentiated. Hence the conception of seven degrees of ascent and seven degrees of descent. It is apparent that such ascent and descent could be systematically measured – really a mathematical achievement. But the mathematics related, not to numerical arithmetic or to space (as in geometry), but to the high and low sounds.

The aesthetic part

However, it is not the function of mathematics to afford pleasure. That function belongs to the realm of aesthetics, which is concerned with the enjoyment of beauty flowing from the permutations and combinations of various notes so that they can be appreciated. And thus was born the brilliant concept of "Raga" – the musical contribution of India, to the world of music.

The contribution of "Raga"

Our scholars of music have described Raga as "that which pleases". This begins with. But the pleasure derived from a Raga should be properly understood. The mind is a treasure house of moods, emotions and impulses – just as it is a house of imagery, ideas and thought currents. The moods and emotions may be floating in the ocean of the psyche. If they are to be preserved, they need to be properly presented.

The function of Ragas

This is exactly what a Raga does. It catches hold of a mood and makes achieves this object, by evolving a structure. Particular notes, which are appropriate to the chosen mood, are selected and their ascent and descent down. It is in this systematic pattern of notes, that the mood of the moment is and permanently preserved. Henceforth, whenever those notes are rendered instrumentally, then the mood, which is supposed to have been reflected in, spontaneously takes birth. At least, that is the expectation. If the rendering evoke the expected mood, the fault may lie in the performer, or in the listener, many other external factors.

Music as communication

The reason is, that music is nothing but communication. And effective communication pre-supposes a sincere and competent performer, a receptive listener and a environment – both physical and psychological.

For example, a person in great physical pain may not respond to the rendering of the Raga Yaman. A student, who has to take a competitive test hour, will not be enthralled at the most beautiful reproduction of the Raga Lalit.

The three harmonies

However, if the environment is congenial and if one is offered a competent rendering of a Raga, then immense spiritual pleasure can be derived. Indian classical music enables one to establish what may be called "three harmonies" – harmony with the Divine and harmony with oneself. For the time being, it dispels unpleasant sensations and installs, on a golden throne, the mood that the Raga is expected to evoke. By promoting total concentration, it enables the performer and the listener, to start on a journey towards the Divine. This is particularly true of Ragas that are sombre in character. Finally, Ragas that capture moods of harmony, can succeed in bringing about or restoring harmony with one's environment, which is the harmony that is sought after, by every individual.

The Dawn the twilight and the shadows of the night

The harmonies mentioned above are achieved in Indian classical music – at least in part by a well-evolved scheme that seeks to assign the proper time for singing a particular Raga. For example, Bhairava is sung in the early morning, because its serious character, resulting from two soft notes that occur (and occupy a dominant position in this Raga), is in harmony with the peaceful atmosphere that prevails in the external world in the early morning and the tranquility that usually pervades the mind itself, at the beginning of the day's activities.

Still more telling, is the example of the Raga Bhairavi – the crowning glory music. This Raga is capable of delineating the deepest emotions of the human can communicate a vast variety of emotions – love, pathos, sweet remembrance, devotion, pleasure of being with ones family and so on. This effect is achieved reason of the fact, that four soft notes find their place in this Raga, and it is these notes – individually or in combinations – that can strike the deepest emotions. Bhairavi, at the end of a concert of music, is like the softest, sweetest dessert end of a hearty meal. Thereafter, no longing is left, in the heart.

The literary aspect

The pleasures of Indian classical music are not merely acoustic. Many compositions that form its repertoire are literary gems in themselves and delicate sentiments in the choicest language. The song "Lat uljhi" – (in Bilawal) for example, encapsulates the most romantic moments of a young newly married couple. The song "Mathura Na Jao" (in Poorvi) depicts, in hardly ten words, the deepest emotion of the Gopis who experience a heart-break, when Krishna announces that he will leave Gokul.

The Southern scenario

What has been stated above is true of both the North and the South. Many Northerners do not enjoy South Indian music, and vice versa. But the differences between the two systems are minor, while the similarities are major. Both depend on the concept of the Raga, even though the names differ. Once the initial hesitation is conquered, it is found that one can enjoy the other system without much difficulty. In fact, many composers and musicians of the South have mastered the music of North India. I have even given us gems of compositions in North Indian Ragas. As regards the Carnatic system (to cite one example), Khan Sahib Abdul Karim Khan has sung compositions in Ragas belonging to the Carnatic system. And the Raga Hansadhvani has become so popular in the North that we tend to forget, that it originally belongs to the South.

Conclusion

Music thus knows no geographical boundaries. Nor does it recognise historical limits. Our musicians have often drawn upon the vast treasure-house of the classical literature of India, compositions of the mediaeval devotional poets and modern poets. They do not hesitate to sing even Sanskrit verses, in appropriate Ragas.

Gujaratis in Delhi

- Mahe

Many Delhi based born and brought up Gujarati and have never studied Gujarat in any school or otherwise. Though they can speak fluently read easily (not h scripts), but can't write.

Most of the Gujaratis in Delhi speak Hindi/English with their children, but when they talk to their spouse/parents they speak in Gujarati. Many Gujaratis feel in Delhi they are miss-fit in Delhi culture-as our culture is so strong that we are not able to be like Delhiwala. We may think so far a short while, but we can't. For us word of mouth is final and we behave and act on it, but most of Delhiwalas say something, do something contrary to it and forgetting it immediately.

Precisely speaking, there is no culture, Manners, honesty, loyalty, faithfulness in most of Delhiwalas. Most of them are money-minded. I would not say business men, they keep some moral standards and they do not bow down just for money. They want a reasonable profit, but not like Delhiwala who charge differently from different people according (judging) to their paying capacity. It is observed that in Gujarat, a commodity is charged at the same rate throughout the market and they will not move for any account. This means they charge fixed price.

Gujarati population in Delhi is increasing like other communities. Many Gujaratis know each other.

In Sixties 'Gujarati Mitra Mandal' was started and had regular monthly meetings. 'Constitution Club' Delhi born Gujaratis almost loses Gujarati touch unless they have relatives in Gujarat/Western India. Thus they become namesake Gujaratis and are like Delhiwala. The warmth of Gujarat and 'Apnapan' (ones own ness) is really missing in addition to Khakra and 'methiya nu masala'.

Almost all Gujarati women are very good cook and her Gujarati dishes everyone likes and they are simple with lots of regards/respect for all guests, etc., Delhi born Gujaratis wish to marry a Gujarati girl so that Gujarati touch comes back in their life. Most Gujaratis inherit many of characteristics of Gujaratis like injustice, they can't tolerate, their children are in that school.

Now we have Gujarati School 'Sardar Patel Vidyalaya' to learn Gujarati. So I think we do not have much problem in learning Gujarati.

Another way to have Gujarati touch is to take memberships of all the Societies/Associations of Delhi. Being in Delhi some of the characteristics of a naturally Delhi born Gujaratis have developed of Delhi like Gujarati food with spices they cannot relish. They like Punjabi food more than south Indian food. But they feel proud to be a Gujarati.

Before, I close down, I have to add here that those Gujaratis who are far away from Gujarati Culture are unfortunate ones, as what they are missing they are not knowing. I wish they should soon revert back to Gujarati culture. Jai Gujarat. Jai India. We are Indians and then Gujarati. True isn't it?
